The Susan Cannon Jones Celebration Scholarship supports the higher education goals of a deserving, non-traditional female student who is also a single parent. The recipient will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Between 17 and 35 years of age
- GPA 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Demonstrated financial need
- Enrolled in a 2 or 4 year accredited college or university
- Successful interview

The Jarvis Moss Shepherd Educational Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who plans to major in business or education. The recipient will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Demonstrated leadership ability
- GPA 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Extra-curricular school activities
- Enrolled in a four year accredited college
- Community service
- Successful Interview

The John and Roberta Hubbard Family Foundation Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior of the Philadelphia High School for Girls majoring in the Arts, Music or Literature who enrolls in a two or four year accredited college. Recipients will be selected based on the following criteria:

- GPA 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Demonstrated leadership ability
- Enrolled in a two or four year-accredited college
- Extra-curricular school activities
- Successful Interview
- Community service

The TILF Philly's Teens Are Cookin'tm Culinary Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who plans to major in culinary arts or attend a culinary arts college or university. The recipient will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Demonstrated leadership ability
- GPA 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Extra-curricular school activities
- Enrolled in a four year accredited college
- Community service
- Successful interview

The Johnny Sample Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who plans to attend the University of Maryland Eastern Shore. The recipient must write a biographical essay on the contributions that John B. Sample, Jr. made as a professional athlete and as a citizen in the Philadelphia community. The recipient will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Demonstrated leadership ability
- GPA 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Extra-curricular school activities
- Enrolled in a four year accredited college
- Community service
- Successful interview

The Vicky Rose Jones Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who meets the following criteria:

- GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- A participant in the Ivy AKAdemy at the time of application
- Extra-curricular school activities
- Enrolled in a four year accredited college
- Demonstrated leadership ability
- Demonstrated academic achievement
- Community service
- Successful interview

All applications must be accompanied by an official transcript, three typewritten letters of reference, and a typewritten essay from the applicant stating future plans and why the scholarship award will help her or him reach future goals. The essay should be a minimum of 200 words and a maximum of 500 words. An additional biographical essay on John B. Sample, Jr. is required for all applicants of the Johnny Sample Memorial Scholarship. The application and all supporting documentation must be submitted together, in one envelope, as one complete package. It is the responsibility of the applicant to have all information submitted on time. Late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered. If additional applications are needed, they can be found at www.ivylegacy.org.

Following the initial review of applications, semi-finalists will be chosen. An interview during the month of April will be scheduled for each semi-finalist. Scholarship winners will be selected from the semi-finalist group and will be notified by May 17, 2011. All completed applications should be postmarked not later than Friday, April 1, 2011 and mailed to:
